- Case management

surprised to receive a round of applause from the entire crowd.

Success Story

A female client came to Prado in 2012 and became a participant in our Safe Parking Program. She was pleasant to be around, but mostly kept to herself. She worked with Case Management from the time she arrived with the goal of saving her money and securing housing. Although she was not interested in any type of mental health assistance, it soon became apparent that she was in need of these services. Her case manager consistently encouraged her to complete a mental health evaluation, and eventually she began mental health care and medication, which have stabilized her life. She has become more outgoing and her fear and anxiety have subsided. With the help of her case manager, she was able to leave the Safe Parking Program and is now housed and very happy. She recently came back to Prado to thank us all for our help and support.
