Staff person Justin reports: One woman at the shelter has shown a lot of concern for another elderly woman, and has transported various clients to appointments in her own car, as well as driving them back and forth between Prado and Maxine Lewis Shelter.

With each month she has shown the strength of character that is tested when people find themselves in dire situations, but do not let the situations destroy them inwardly. A short time ago while she waited in the lunch line, she reported that she was trying to sell her car because she was planning on moving, as she was looking to open up more opportunities for herself. A few days later she was excited to tell staff that she has been approved to get an apartment in San Diego,



and she is looking forward to the move. It is wonderful to see this woman, who was always concerned with others, regardless of her situation in life, finally get a break.

Staff person Leesa reports: A returning client is one of the nicest, funniest, and most cooperative clients we have. Sometime earlier in the year he got very sick, missed a lot of work, and ultimately lost his job. In spite of this, he kept an optimistic attitude, focusing on the positive aspects of sleeping outside, even when it was cold and wet. No matter what chore he is assigned by staff, he does it well. I was happy to hear that he recently got a job at a department store. He is now on priority (which guarantees him a bed at the shelter or overflow), and back on his plan to getting a place of his own. We wish him all the best.
