## 40 Prado Sets the Bar

Many communities throughout California are struggling with homelessness, and they are looking to 40 Prado as the model of genuine success! Providing temporary housing and services for the homeless population can be a daunting task. Often, communities oppose the construction of homeless shelters, and funding can be a challenge. However, 40 Prado is a shining example of how our community has come together to beat the odds and create something extraordinary. The California Community Economic Development Association (CCEDA) has taken notice of the great success of 40 Prado and has written a case study to document the processes that went in to building and running this center in order to educate and enlighten other communities throughout the state.

The 40 Prado Homeless Services Center is a 365-days-per-year, 24/7 facility that helps individuals and families improve their health and stability by providing meals, shelter and medical care. The center also helps move clients toward self-sufficiency through case management, after school programs, job training, and job placement assistance. Since opening in September 2018, 40 Prado has been operating at full capacity. They are continuing to add benefits and services for the men, women, and children who need assistance.

Many other cities and communities are trying to find answers, and they are looking to 40 Prado as an example. According to Jim Famalette, COO of CAPSLO, they have been sharing information with, "groups from Bakersfield, Visalia and San Benito, all of whom are looking at trying to build something." The comprehensive nature of 40 Prado, with the shelter, programs and medical care all under one roof, is unique, and other communities are using 40 Prado as a model, hoping to achieve similar success. Kevin Senada, who authored the case study for the CCEDA, concluded that, "The opening of the 40 Prado Homeless Services Center provides a successful example of a community-wide approach to addressing homelessness and demonstrates that money is essential, but that relying on one entity or a one-time investment will not solve a complex problem that manifested over decades. Supporting local efforts to manage homelessness takes sustained time, public and private investment, and leadership across a community."

# **40Prado** Success Story

"Efrain" came to the Recuperative Care Program after a partial foot amputation as a result of diabetes. He and RCP staff were challenged by a longer than expected healing process. Due to immigration status and medical ineligibility, he had limited access to medical services. Unable to continue working, Efrain ended up in a situation of homelessness with no support. During his stay in RCP, staff connected him to community resources to assist in meeting some of his needs.

Efrain was passionate about following a diabetic diet and spent a time educating himself on his condition. He was dedicated to living the best life possible and did everything "by the book". Getting back to his job and home and "being able to dance again"

motivated him. He maintained a positive outlook even when things were not progressing the way they were supposed to.

After several months, his wound started to close. As soon as he was cleared to bear weight, he was out of his wheelchair and finding creative ways to provide his own type of physical therapy. Thanks to Caitlin May, the CHC Nurse Practitioner, and a generous donor, he will also now be able to get a partial foot prosthesis. With his hard work and the support of RCP and many others, Efrain left 40 Prado on December 20<sup>th</sup> to return home!
